

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Executive Summary

Monadnock Region Rail Trail Collaborative's (MRRTC) mission is to create a rail trail network, within the Monadnock region, that is suitable for year-round use by all permitted user types. The MRRTC convenes rail trail advocates and volunteers, provides technical assistance with project planning and coordination, and advocates for greater awareness of the many local and regional benefits to improving rail trails.

All the accomplishments you will read within this annual report were due to efforts of many individuals and organizations. The MRRTC's level of each project involvement ranged from full engagement to no involvement and everything in-between. 2024 Activities:

■ The Monadnock rail trail is generally in good shape through Jaffrey.

- The Sno-Moles snowmobile club has been diligent in cutting back brush, mowing, and filling in soft spots. Bridges are in good shape as is signage.
- Five benches were acquired in 2024. Four donated by Belletetes of Jaffrey and one earned from recycyling 1.000 lbs of plastic. Unfortunately, the benches have not been installed pending state approval, site locations, and volunteer work crew coordination. All five benches are being stored courtesty of the Jaffrey DPW. Placques recognizing the donors are ready to be affized once the benches are installed.



2024 Activities:

- The combined benefits of the ongoing summer brush hogging program and the 2023 drainage improvements led to greatly increased use of the Cheshire Rail Trail in Walpole by pedestrians and bicyclists in 2024. Work during the past year focused on maintaining the rail trail in its improved condition and beginning to plan for future improvements:
 - Brush hogged the mostly grassy surface of the entire 7-mile rail trail twice in the summer.
 - Cut and cleared many trees and branches blocking the trail. Also cut back encroaching vegetation.
 - Cleared silt, leaves and debris from drainage ditches, culverts and water bars. Thirteen volunteers participated in a late autumn trail work day to help maintain the 2023 drainage improvements.
 - Gave two presentations to Walpole audiences about options for future development of the Cheshire Rail Trail in Walpole.
